Background

The Standards Board for England (the Board) have produced a new DVD to help Monitoring Officers, Members and Standards Committees understand their obligations under the recently revised Code of Conduct which was adopted by the Council on 25th September 2007.

Introduction

- The DVD uses a fictional scenario to explore a number of aspects of the Code, following the story of a group of Members and local authority officers as they prepare to discuss a highly controversial planning application.
- As the plot unfolds, the story addresses areas that can cause confusion and presents solutions to potential difficulties. Training sections and commentary are interspersed with the drama and explores issues in more detail. Among the rules discussed are those on declaring interests, disclosing confidential information and bullying.

Use of the DVD

- The DVD will be of particular value to new and continuing Members who need to increase their understanding of certain points of the revised Code.
- The Monitoring Officer is planning to make use of the DVD in a further programme of training workshops designed for Members including Town/Parish Council Members.
- The workshops are due to commence in November and will run on a weekly basis concentrating on the provisions of the revised Code.
