38. <u>MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING</u>

Resolved: That, the minutes of the Meeting of the Council held on 12 May 2009, pages 11 to 16, be approved as a correct record.

39. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

The list of interests declared at meetings from 11 November 2009 to 15 February 2010 was noted.

Cllr. Mrs. Hunter declared a personal interest in Minute Item 43(b) as a Council appointed representative on Sevenoaks and Swanley Citizens' Advice Bureau.

40. <u>CHAIRMAN'S ANNOUNCEMENTS</u>

The Chairman made no announcements.

41. <u>PETITIONS FROM MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC</u>

No petitions were received from members of the public.

42. <u>MATTERS CONSIDERED BY THE CABINET AND/OR OTHER</u> COMMITTEES

These were discussed under their respective items. The Budget, Capital Programme

and Investment Strategy reports were discussed together under the Council Tax and Revenue Budget item.

43. <u>TO CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING REPORTS FROM THE CHIEF</u> <u>EXECUTIVE OR OTHER DIRECTORS ON MATTERS REQUIRING THE</u> <u>ATTENTION OF COUNCIL</u>

(a) <u>Monitoring Officer's Report</u>

The Chairman moved that the Council's Procedure Rules be suspended to the extent necessary to allow the Independent Chairman of the Standards Committee, Mr. Riddell to move the recommendation and take part in the ensuing debate.

The motion was CARRIED.

Further to meetings of the Standards Committee and the Performance and Governance Committee, Mr. Riddell moved, and Cllr. Bracken seconded, that the Monitoring Officer's Report 2009 be noted.

During the debate, the Leader of the Council replied to a question from a Member by confirming that the Council was committed to ensuring it complied with its obligations under equalities legislation.

At the end of the debate, the Chairman thanked Mr. Riddell for his long service to the Council as Chairman of the Standards Committee.

Resolved: That the Monitoring Officer's Report 2009 be noted.

(b) <u>Council Tax Setting and Budget 2010/11</u> (Report 6b)

The Chairman ruled that late information circulated since the publication of the agenda be accepted as a matter of urgency, due to the special circumstances that the information could not have been made available earlier as the relevant organisations had not made their decisions when the agenda was circulated.

Further to meetings of the three Select Committees, the Performance and Governance Committee and the Cabinet, Cllr. Fleming moved and Cllr. Ramsay seconded that the recommendations contained in Appendix 2 of the report be adopted.

Cllr. Walshe moved and Cllr. Gilbert seconded the following amendment:

"Reduction in Revenue Spending:

Civic Expenses - £4,000 Contact Centre - £230,000 CCTV - £226,000 Communications - £14,000

Total - £474,000

Enabling Restoration of Revenue Spending:

Community Grants - £10,000 Youth Programme - £15,000 Leisure Contract - £25,000 Minibuses - £8,000 Arts Outreach - £10,000 Conservation - £30,000

Total - £98,000

Cancel increase in Council Tax - costing £330,355

Balance - saved £45,645 to reserves."

Members held a full debate on the proposed amendment. Under Council Procedure Rule 24.4, five Members demanded that a recorded vote be held.

Cllrs. Abraham, Bosley, Mrs. Bosley, Mrs. Bracken, Brookbank, Mrs. Broomby, Brown, Bruce, Chard, Mrs. Clark, Coates, Mrs. Cook, Cooke, Davison, Mrs. Davison, Dean, Fleming, Gaywood, Golding, Grint, Mrs. Hunter, London, Loney, Mrs. Lowe, Maskell, McInnes, Ms. Moore, Mrs. Morris, Orridge, Mrs. Parkin, Pett, Piper, Ramsay, Ryan, Scholey and Waller voted AGAINST the amendment.

Cllrs. Lankester and Miss Stack ABSTAINED.

The amendment was LOST.

Cllr. Harrod moved and Cllr. Wigg seconded a further amendment as follows:

"1) The cuts of \pounds 7,000 and \pounds 10,000 in grants to the Citizens' Advice Bureaux and other voluntary organisations are not implemented. This to be funded by a reduction of \pounds 10,000 in the budget for In Shape, i.e. one edition, and a further reduction of \pounds 7,000 in the Civic Expenditure Budget.

2) That the Members' Allowance growth item be delayed for one year, making a saving of £47,153 which will be used to fund a reduction in the Council tax increase."

Members debated the proposed amendment. Under Council Procedure Rule 24.4, five Members demanded that a recorded vote be held.

Cllrs. Darrington, Dibsdall, Gilbert, Golding, Harrod, McGarvey, Mrs. Purves, Mrs. Sargeant, Underwood, Walshe and Wigg voted FOR the amendment.

Cllrs. Abraham, Bosley, Mrs. Bosley, Mrs. Bracken, Brookbank, Mrs. Broomby, Bruce, Mrs. Clark, Coates, Mrs. Cook, Cooke, Davison, Mrs. Davison, Dean, Fleming, Gaywood, Grint, Mrs. Hunter, Mrs. Lowe, Maskell, McInnes, Ms. Moore, Mrs. Morris, Orridge, Mrs. Parkin, Pett, Piper, Ramsay, Ryan, Scholey and Waller voted AGAINST the amendment. Cllrs. Brown, Chard, Lankester, London, Loney and Miss Stack ABSTAINED.

The amendment was LOST.

Members returned to debating the original motion. This was put to the vote and it was Resolved:

- (a) That:-
 - (i) the Summary of Council Expenditure and Council Tax 2010/11 be approved; (Cabinet 18th February 2010); (Appendix 3)
 - (ii) the Financial Plan 2009/10 to 2015/16 be approved; (Cabinet 18th February 2010); (Appendix 3)
 - (iii) the following changes to reserves and provisions be approved:
 - 1. A Budget Stabilisation Reserve be set up, and any underspend against the 2009/10 budget be allocated to this reserve;
 - 2. £456,000 be allocated to the Capital Reserve in 2010/11 and £480,000 a year from 2011/12, to be funded from the Revenue Budget; and
 - 3. £20,000 be allocated to a new Civic Expenses Transport Reserve in 2009/10. (Cabinet 18th February 2010).
 - (iv) the Prudential Indicators 2010/11 required by Part 1 of the Local Government Act 2003 be approved; (Cabinet 18th February 2010);
 - (v) the Council's Annual Investment Strategy 2010/11 be approved (Cabinet 18th February 2010);
 - (vi) the Capital Programme 2010/13, and Asset Maintenance 2010/11 budget of £738,000 be approved; (Cabinet 18th February 2010).
- (b) that it be noted that at the Cabinet meeting on 21st January 2010 the Council calculated the amount of 50,426.50 as its council tax base for the year 2010/11 in accordance with Regulation 3 of the Local Authorities (Calculation of Council Tax Base) Regulations 1992 made under Section 33(5) of the Local Government Finance Act 1992;
 - (i) 50,426.50 being the amount calculated by the Council, in accordance with Regulation 3 of the Local Authorities (Calculation of Council Tax Base) Regulations 1992, as its Council tax base for the year;

- (c) that the following amounts be now calculated by the Council for the year 2010/11 in accordance with Sections 32 to 36 of the Local Government Finance Act 1992:-
- (i) £57,495,787 being the aggregate of the amounts which the Council estimates for the items set out in Section 32(2) (a) to (e) of the Act.
- (ii) £38,702,414 being the aggregate of the amounts which the Council estimates for the items set out in Section 32(3) (a) to (c) of the Act.
- (iii) £18,793,373 being the amount by which the aggregate at (c)(i) above exceeds the aggregate at (c)(ii) above, calculated by the Council, in accordance with Section 32(4) of the Act, as its budget requirement for the year.
- (iv) £6,348,311 being the aggregate of the sums which the Council estimates will be payable for the year into its general fund in respect of redistributed non-domestic rates and revenue support grant.
- (v) £246.80 being the amount at (c)(iii) above less the amount at (c)(iv) above, all divided by the amount at (b)(i) above, calculated by the Council, in accordance with Section 33(1) of the Act, as the basic amount of its council tax for the year.
- (vi) £3,272,986 being the aggregate amount of all special items referred to in Section 34 (1) of the Act.
- (vii) £181.89 <u>being the amount at (c)(v) above less the result given by dividing the</u> <u>amount at (c)(vi) above by the amount at (b)(i) above, calculated by</u> <u>the Council, in accordance with Section 34 (2) of the Act, as the</u> <u>basic amount of its council tax for the year for dwellings in those</u> <u>parts of its area to which no special item relates.</u>

 - (d) that it be noted that for the year 2010/2011 the Kent County Council, the Kent Police Authority and the Kent & Medway Towns Fire Authority have stated the following amounts in precepts issued to the Council, in accordance with Section 40 of the Local Government Finance Act 1992, for each of the categories of dwellings shown below:-

Resolved: The proposed amendments to the Contract Procedure Rules (contained within Appendix A of the report) be approved and the Constitution be amended accordingly.
