
## Neighbournood Policing

number of constables being increased and the adoption of an extended working day Neighbourhand Teams have increased significantly under the new model with the from Zam with Sant. The shift pattern reflects demand, resulting in officers being available when required. Neighbourhand officers attend all incidents of anti-social behaviour (ASB), incidents not requiring an immediate response and reported crime within their district.

Officers also carry out targeted patrols and police the night time economy. Officers record and investigate the majority of crime reports they attend; crime outside of their remit is then passed to detectives within the Crime Investigation Units. Police Community Support Officers are the front line response to ASB, Problem solving and community engagement.

District policing is supported by Community Safety Unit, co located partnership Police, SDC, Environmental Health, WKHousing, Sevenoaks Dst Council.




