Please summarise the work of the organisation:

An Early Years Intervention Sure Start Scheme to make sure children from deprived/difficult backgrounds get a similar start in life to people born in more prosperous settings. They work hand in hand with Social Services and run parenting groups and courses as well as activities (music, craft etc) for children. They cater for anything to do with the Early Years Foundation Stage (0-5 years) looking at playing, healthy eating, home safety, standards of living, social problems (alcohol/drug abuse) and anti social behaviour. Anyone with a child aged 0-5 can use the service but they particularly target travellers (they are not very happy about coming to the centre but the centre goes to them if they have a specific problem), ethnic minorities (Polish courses), people with social problems. Aim to stop people falling through the net. To give parents confidence to build their lives and signpost other places where they can get help where necessary example further education. Be a place for isolated parents to meet others and support each other. Subtle courses on subjects such as domestic abuse and work with the Basement at the Eden Centre to reach out to young parents. They work with all the childrens centres in the District but are the sister centre to Dunton Green.

What are the main challenges faced by the organisation?

Getting as many people through the door as possible

Do their clients come from the Sevenoaks District or a wider area?

Mainly Edenbridge Town Centre by walking. They technically cover the following villages but they don't tend to come in large numbers due to difficulty in getting there: Cowden, Hever, Leigh, Chiddingstone, Penshurst and Fordcombe.

Who mainly refers clients to them? How to people know about their services?

They bring themselves in, the centre finds them, Midwives, Health visitors, Schools, pre-schools, Neighbours, SDC

Who are their primary funders?

KCC

Do they benefit from any contact with the District Council?

Yes. They work closely with Kelly Webb and her team as well attending Gypsy Liaison Meetings and Steering Groups.

If so, can this be improved (within existing resources)?
