This area is a quiet residential area at night and the proposed increase in the licensing hours would open up this premises for use as an events or party venue dramatically increasing the noise levels. In addition the amount of traffic on the local residential roads would dramatically increase with the inevitable noise and safety implications. The access to this premises is via Hollybush Close where Hollybush court is situated. This complex houses "extra care" housing for the elderly and the Age UK day centre.
