Subject: Sevenoaks District Council Housing Allocation Policy Amendments

Details of Decision taken

- 1. To add a Band E for people with no housing need or connection to the Sevenoaks District.
- 2. To amend bedroom size requirements to provide choice for register applicants by allowing households aged 55+ to bid for sheltered/emerald housing or other specifically designated accommodation that has one more bedroom than they need (1 person in a 2 bedroom property).
- 3. To allow applicants aged 55+ who have an adult child (over 18) in their household to be accepted onto the register to bid for sheltered/emerald housing or other specifically designated accommodation that is covered by a planning agreement whether they have a local connection or not.
- 4. To allow applicants aged 55+ who have an adult child (over 18) in their household to apply to the housing register for vacancies that are covered by a planning agreement only to have an income up to the current Low Cost Home Ownership limit (currently £60,000).
- 5. To bring down the number of weeks at which the register will recognise an unborn child as part of a register applicant's household from 28 weeks to 26 weeks.
- 6. To amend the text to set out more clearly the review process for homeless households who wish to refuse an offer of accommodation made to them in discharge of any homelessness duty owed.
- 7. To amend the text to allow provision for a senior manager at West Kent Housing Association to make a review decision at stage 1 of the register review process.

Reason for Decision

To agree the above 7 extra criteria so that the Sevenoaks District Housing Register Allocation policy correctly reflects local needs and embraces local lettings policies and provides a fair review process.
