
WHY GATWICK?

- Excellent transport links




BENEFITS AND OPPORTUNITIES FOR SEVENOAKS DISTRICT

- 22,000 additional airport related jobs
- £3.75m apprenticeship fund
- Airport related supply chain opportunities
- A new runway would create a catalytic affect stimulating the local economy
- Transport improvements greater stimulus for east-west connections e.g.
 - Helping to build the case to enhance the North Downs Line before a second runway opens
 - Exploring further opportunities to strengthen E-W rail links with Network Rail (e.g. via Redhill)
 - Exploring how a second runway can improve the business case for rail links with Kent




26L westerly arrivals swathe at Gatwick August 2014 817 air traffic movements


26L westerly arrivals swathe at Gatwick, August 2014 - 817 air traffic movements




26L westerly arrivals swathe at Gatwick August 2013 818 air traffic movements




26L westerly operations at Gatwick illustrating the BIGGIN holding stack and non-Gatwick traffic above Sevenoaks 2015
