How have you been able to involve the local community in planning this project?

'There are many residents in Kemsing who require support due to loss of hearing - whilst many are elderly deafness can affect people of all ages and we are an inclusive organisation.

We have discussed these issues with them and have the support of the Local Parish Council, District Members and other Community Groups like the Church

7 What is the need for the project?

One in six people is deaf or hard of hearing. Hi Kent runs a network of similar clinics throughout Kent, for which we received the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service in 2007. Until now, lack of funds has meant that we have been unable to provide one of these clinics in Kemsing or any of the surrounding villages.

People with hearing loss will be able to access this very valuable free service within their local community and at no cost to themselves. Through regular help and advice from trained volunteers, they get the maximum benefit from their hearing aids and advice on other equipment that is available, they will be able to engage more with their community and enjoy better quality of life.

- 4 **Description of Project:**
The Village Hall is in urgent need of upgrading / refurbishment if we are to continue to be able to support its administration, overheads and maintenance from the letting income we receive. The project involves:
1) Updating all toilet blocks and shower room facilities with low water usage and energy saving sanitaryware and lighting.
2) Rebuilding the disabled toilet to increase ease of access and make it more private.
3) Replacing the Central Heating Boiler with 2 highly energy efficient Combi Boilers.
4) Replacing the kitchen with easy to clean and maintain fixtures and fittings.
5) Redecorating The Hope Room including laying heavy duty flooring and concealed energy efficient lighting.
6) Installing Hearing Loops in 2 Main Halls.
- 5 **Total project cost: £ 73000**
How will the money be spent? Quotes have been received for Boilers, Hearing Loops, Toilets, Kitchen and Refurbishment costs. A Steering Group consisting of Trustees will appoint contractors and manage the budget.



4 Description of Project:

The primary aim of project will be to clear a derelict section of the Darenth Relief Channel running parallel to the A25 and River Darenth, (see attached map), so as to reduce the risk of flooding and improve leisure activities and access. There will be a subsidiary aim of improving drainage into the Channel from the Recreation Ground and its football pitches.

5 Total project cost: £ 6260
£5760 (including VAT) Relief Channel clearance, and
£1000 Enhanced pitch drainage.
Total: £6760 (incl VAT)

How will the money be spent?

This is a stand-alone project, but is also Stage 1 of a wider scheme. Stage 2 would be a link to and revive what was historically an integrated leisure area including ornamental gardens, a lido and integrated management of river and flood waters.

Stage 1 is concerned with the Darenth Relief Channel used to provide a relief or

overflow for the River Darenth and the Combe Bank Estate Lake. The Channel runs along the southern edge Sundridge Recreation Ground and is parallel to the A25 and the River Darenth

The purpose of the Stage 1 project is to create a safe leisure facility for the community including children, enhancing existing sporting use by Chipsted FC and other teams with an emphasis on junior participation, provide improved flood relief and encourage bio-diversity and wild life habitat.

To achieve this it will be necessary to:

1. (a) Removal silt so as to deepen the Channel; (b) Remove overgrown, fallen, self-planted and dangerous trees to improve water flow and capacity; (c) Clear banks (d) Open up the Channel to light and air to encourage bio-diversity, and improve pedestrian access

2. Install underground drainage to reduce water logging (at bottom of natural sloping) of pitches by draining water into Channel and (a) there by increasing the number of "playable days" and (b) improving access to Relief Channel from the Recreation Ground banks

6 Your community

How have you been able to involve the local community in planning this project?

Wide ranging support has been received following discussions have taken place with local residents suffering flood related issues in the winter of 2013-2014; neighbouring land owners; Recreation Ground users such as Chipstead Football Club; local and central government agencies and volunteer groups , with an environmental focus, such as the Environment Agency and Kent Rivers Trust. The Sevenoaks District Council Tree Officer has been consulted and involved in the development of the scheme. It is expect local volunteers will be involved in cleartence work through such activities as a "logathon".

7 What is the need for the project?

The Dareth Relief Channel was created in the ~1870s to manage water flows and flooding into and from the River Dareth and from the Combe Bank Estate Lake. It was part of a larger park land, lake and publically access ornamental garden and publically access ornamental gardens, walk ways and lido.

With the break-up of the Combe Bank Estate, ownership in the early 1900s became fragmented with the result that management became less effective, water flow reduced and flood risks exacerbated and with increased water-logging of land fringing the Channel, such as Sundridge Recreation Ground football pitches. In the latter case water fails to drain sufficiently from slopping ground so that fixtures have to be cancelled on both junior mini-pitches and full size senior pitches.

8 Long term benefits

Please comment on the lasting effects of the project:

1. Measurable increases in water flow, enhanced ecological and bio- diversity, improved leisure usage, increased capacity to play football and run junior training sessions during the winter period.

2. It is anticipated that this scheme will prove the launch pad for (Stage 2) schemes to extending leisure and generate environmental improvements that including opening up the derelict lido area. This could include foot and cycle tracks to the west (see map) Improved water flow will reduce flood risks and and with improved drainage will reduce interruptions to winter sporting fixtures and training sessions. It is anticipated that ecological diversity will improve, including fish numbers, and lead to wider leisure use. It is expected that the improved and safer access to the Channel will prove a valuable asset for local children and enhance curriculum delivery by the local primary school.

It is anticipated that this will be the first stage in triggering the opening up of the lido and ornamental gardens as a leisure facility with the creation of foot and cycle tracks.

How have you been able to involve the local community in planning this project?

Presenting plans and taking advice from Westerham Town Council, raising awareness within the local community about fundraising events through local publications/Visit Westerham website, holding Open Days for the local community to experience playing bowls, with follow-up sessions for those wishing to find out more, funded the last three years by an annual award from the Bowls Development Alliance.

7 What is the need for the project?

The Club House is over 30 years old, was purchased second-hand from Bromley Council, is inefficient and uneconomic to heat, having virtually no insulation, and lacks the space to accommodate the current membership safely and comfortably. There is virtually no scope to increase the footprint of the existing building. More space would mean a full length short mat (possibly two) could be laid down thus making it viable all year round. Modern, spacious facilities would enable our Club to promote, organize and host events for the wider bowling community, e.g. County matches, League Finals, County Touring Teams (Kent & other Counties) thus raising the Club's profile and generating revenue.

8 Long term benefits

Will enable an increase in Summer membership and the opportunity to establish a short mat club in the Winter which will lead to increased use and revenue. Will provide a modern facility to carry the sport forward and secure our 109 year old Club's future for years to come making it a continuing asset within Westerham's King George V Playing Fields .




