




- Address impact of industrialisation

 poor housing and unhealthy conditions
- · Address north south divide
- Address environmental concerns

Benefits:

- Affordable Housing
- Providing a mix of housing types
- Safeguard open space, sport and recreational facilities
- Funding towards air quality monitoring

- Duty to Co-operate requirements

- Plan for an ageing population

- Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL)

The Future

Government has recently issued a response to a House of Lords Select Committee report on the built environment.

Part of the response deals with future changes to the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) such as:

- the inclusion of specific health and wellbeing policies,
- firming up the existing design policies, and
- other elements about housing, retail and employment.
