How have you been able to involve the local community in planning this project?

Underriver has a long history of supporting BIG National occasions with some kind of Village event which have historically been well attended and supported, e.g. The Underriver Millennium Experience and Golden Jubilee weekend celebrations in 2002. At the street party for the Golden Jubilee, 322 attended from the village which has only 350 (approx) total residents.

For this event specifically:

The UVA has gone out to the whole village community looking for volunteers to run specific activities over the weekend. The event is being organised by 2 sub committees (one for the Street Party and one for the Underriver Games), so approx 35 residents are directly involved in the planning of the event, i.e. 10% of the village's residents. Plus various organisations will be directly involved in the weekend of activities including the Church (it's choir and congregation), The Horticultural Society, TUG (the Thursday Underriver Group), and the White Rock (the local pub).

The event will be well publicised between now and the Diamond Jubilee weekend via these same clubs and societies, the monthly Underriver News Sheet and the village website.

# 7 What is the need for the project?

To sieze the opportunity of a positive national event to galvanise community spirit within the village. Underriver is geographically spaced out over a wide area and has few central meeting points where this kind of community spirit can be generated naturally. #### 6 Your community

How have you been able to involve the local community in planning this project?

Unfortunately, the strict Non Disclosure requirements of LOCOG have precluded discussions with local groups prior to the official annoucement on the route on 7th November 2011. However, this item has been considered carefully by the Chevening Parish Council at its monthly meeting, also on 7th November 2011, and a resolution passed to erect these banners, subject to Grant aid, and to engage with community groups to promote this event to ensure successful animation of the route by the whole community, particularly at Bessels Green, where the Relay will end within the Sevenoaks DC boundary. Chevening Primary School has already started this process by being accepted onto the 'Get Set' inititative, embracing the spirit of the Olympics, which the PC will build upon.

# 7 What is the need for the project?

To act as a catalyst for local activities to celebrate this once-in-a-lifetime event, thereby supporting Sevenoaks District Council in promoting the Olympic Torch Relay's objectives for connecting young people to sport, to the 2012 London Olympic Values and to the rest of the world.

4 Description of Project:

A number of local action and community groups within Swanley have got together to organise a one day Christmas event including Christmas carolers, a Santa's Grotto, Live Reindeers with a sleigh, a Christmas cartoon tent, a Christmas craft tent, an inflatable snow globe, and hopefully a synthetic ice rink. The event is taking place in Swanley town centre for which all relevant permissions have been obtained. It is on Monday December 19<sup>th</sup> from 2pm until 8pm. Children break up from school during the previous week so thought has been put into the date and time. The Mayor of Swanley has offered to open the event and we have managed to secure participation and various donations to improve the overall event from some local retailers.

# 5 Total project cost: £ 1686

How will the money be spent? The grant will be used to pay the hire fees of the synthetic ice rink. This company was the best value for money and had the best facilities available and access to all age ranges both abled and disabled for a reasonable cost compared to other companies. The items included in the price are as follows.

- Ice Rink fully erected and dismanteld
- Trained staff. 1 to oversee the rink, snow machine, music etc, 1 to assist in handing out skates and one to assist those on the ice who may need help
- Ice Safety Barriers
- Matting for enterance/exit area
- 75 pairs of Skates in a variety of sizes and duel bladed toddler over skates
- Skate benches
- Mini Marquee to house the skates
- Mini Marquee to use a skate change area
- Generator

- Sound system with music
- Snow machine for real snow effect
- Standard and Blue tint flood lights
- Disabled skaters chair
- Risk Assessment
- £10m public liability insurance

The event on the whole is a non profit making one allowing it to be accessable for low income families. We are intending to provide the ice rink free of charge. This is in keeping with activities provided by the other community groups involved. The other groups participating in the project have applied for grants to fund their activities through organisations such as Linda Hogan (WKH), KCC and local banks and retailers. Members of the community have volunteered to donate their time in assisting with marshalling the ice rink along with the other activities.

There are no other funders contributing to the hire cost of the synthetic ice rink.

How have you been able to involve the local community in planning this project?

This really has been a huge effort by all residents together to bring such a wonderful Christmas event to Swanley

The event overall has been a long time coming. It has been a challenge getting conflicted local action groups to work together however nobody can argue with Christmas spirit. This really is a labour of love and an opportunity not to be missed as all participants are keen to get involved and provide such a magical event for the residents of our town and surrounding areas.

We believe that by bringing a number of community groups to work together in this way, there will be bridges built. This has resulted in a greater sense of safety, security and well being due to boundry issues being diffused and paving the way that in future we can pull together making better use of shared resources promoting a much wider community spirit for the residents of Swanley and visitors to our area.
