There is no problem in sharing my email as the "restricted" marking appears automatically. I wasn't sure of your role but cc'd you as the advected had obviously been in contact with you previously. The primary Police concern is in relation to the associated car crime in that road which is running about 70 offences over a 12 month period. This represents the only significant crime hot spot in the Sevenoaks District and is therefore requiring significant policing resources to deter & detect further offences. Undoubtably we are in this position due the high volume of cars parked outside the train station for a prolonged period of time with little or no passing pedestrian surveillance.

The location features consistently within the District Community Safety Partnership Meetings and therefore we need to find a sustainable solution, which from my perspective can only be the removal of the vehicles through the implementation of parking restrictions.

I'm back at work next week if you would like to discuss. I would appreciate if you can keep me updated from your perspective.

I have been passed an email you sent to a Mr Bracey at Sevenoaks District Council on the 30th January in relation to the parking problem at Knockholt Railway Station. Please be rest assured that the Police totally support the need for parking restrictions to be put in place urgently in order to prevent an accident and additionally combat what is now an escalating crime problem associated with the parked cars. Both the Parish Council and myself have been in contact with Michael Sammut (Kent Highways Senior Transport Engineer) who is now dealing with the issue. Mr Sammut stated today that limited restrictions would be in place immanently in Old London Road and Wheatsheaf Hill, Halstead which will be "designed to deal with the on-street

Mr Samut stated today that limited restrictions would be in place immanently in Old London Road and Wheatshear Hill, Halstead which will be "designed to deal with the on-street commuter parking issues, at the most safety critical parking locations". He further stated "It is planned to carry out a post completion review of these restrictions, with a particular focus on the potential to extend on-street restrictions if necessary. This is usually carried out in the 6 and 12 month period post completion". I appreciate your frustration in relation to lack of positive action and having now become involved I am anxious to push for comprehensive parking restrictions where feasible. Thank you for your comments, I will append them to the report that is to be presented to the March meeting of the Sevenoaks Joint Transportation Board.

The District Council's original proposals were for P&D (including pay-by-phone) managed parking bays along one side of the road (but not near junctions) with double yellow lines along the other. The area would then be patrolled by our civil enforcement officers, so there would be a visible presence in the area. Due to the length and number of cars involve our officers would spend a reasonable period on-site checking tickets / registrations etc. so this is likely to have had a beneficial car crime deterrent effect.

Additionally, our enforcement officers make notes when valuables are left on display or vehicles left unsecured etc and where we have contact details (for example where someone has registered to pay by phone) then the information can be passed on. This seems to work quite effectively in our off-street car parks.

With regard to the options you put forward for exploration - as I understand it there are a number of issues associated with planning controls and land usage with the adaptation of most of the non-highway land in that area. I understand that this applies to both the areas within Sevenoaks District and the land just over the border in the London Borough of Bromley. It is not so say that these issues are impossible to resolve, but a solution via this route is unlikely to be available quickly. Also, there would be significant costs in the development of a new off-street parking area, and it is not evident who would meet that up-front cost - the District Council is unlikely to be in a position to consider such a move.



Thank you for copying me into your response to Gillian. My additional concern in relation to Old London Road is the associated car crime that is being generated and the continual need to conduct both overt and covert Policing operations there. In the last twelve months there have been around seventy offences against vehicles, predominantly number plate thefts and therefore is the greatest crime hot spot for the Sevenoaks District. We have made arrests but the problem persists as clearly the Police do not have the resources to be there all day, every day.

I have no doubt that due to the geography of the road, the fact that vehicles are parked all day with little or no pedestrian activity, the location has become very familiar to the criminal fraternity residing in the South London Boroughs. I therefore have a real concern that the location will continue to be a real traffic hazzard and crime hot spot thus significantly drain my resources which would be better deployed elsewhere.

The only sustainable solution from my perspective is to put in place parking restrictions, although I appreciate some work would need to be done in consideration of displacement. I understand you already have some restrictions planned and would be grateful if you let me see any such plans which I can compare with the Police crime data.

Thank you for your email with attached letter dated 16 February 2011.

I last updated you on the progress of the proposed waiting restrictions in Old London Road, Halstead, in my email to you on 10 February. The current status remains the same, as I am still unable to provide you with the actual start date in February or March these works are expected to start. I will pass on this information as soon as I know.

Thank you for letting me know of the current parking situation in Old London Road, which has been caused by the the railway embankment works, presently in progress. I will indeed pay a visit to the site this week to observe the situation for myself.

I have in the recent past asked the Police to attend Old London Road to understand the problems that are occurring and deal with any matters as they see fit. I will again ask for their assistance in the light of the current circumstances you have described.

Clearly, it is my view that the new parking controls, when they are implemented, need to be carefully monitored in order to determine their impact and understand if there are any resultant adverse effects. As you know, a review of the proposed restrictions is to be carried out at least 6 months post scheme implementation which is routine procedure, but I will need to decide if this needs to be brought forward.

The proposed scheme, as you know, also involves relocating the west bound bus stop, opposite the Station access and, the installation of bus-stop clearways at all four bus stops in Old London Road, west of Watercroft Road. These measures are designed to ensure that buses have good and proper access to each bus stop facility accordingly.

I propose to get back to you in due course, following my next site visit, to let you know of my findings and any consequential recommendations I may intend to take forward.




