Dear Mr Bracey

Thank you for your letter dated 24th November 2010 and enclosed drawing concerning the above subject.

Kent Police have no specific observations to make regarding this proposal, however in general terms we would expect the following:

- The application meets the necessary criteria.
- The introduction of prohibition of waiting complies in all respect with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002.
- If being used for 'corner protection' the prohibition of waiting restriction is for a 24-hour period and extends for a distance of at least 10 metres from any junction. Thus preventing vehicles mistakenly parking during the hours of darkness and contravening provisions of the Roads Vehicles Lighting Regulations 1994.
- The introduction of such measures will not leave the Police with the task of carrying out constant enforcement issues such as obstruction by transferring the problem to other areas.
- The safety of other road users is not compromised by the introduction of these measures.

Civil Parking Enforcement will require your Authority to ensure resources are available to enforce this proposal.

Dear Mr Bracey,

Our apologies for the following belated comments with regard to your letter dated 24th November, and we hope that they will still be taken into account.

We live at Hitchen Hatch Lane and at present very few cars use the marked parking bays opposite our house.

However on the rare occasion that they do it is particularly dangerous for us exiting, and returning from our drive. We have limited sight lines up and down the road as we're on a slight bend and cars can be going quite fast at this point having got up the incline further down (Station end), or come through the narrow bit of the road at the top (Vine end).

We are used to this, but there would be a problem if the parking bay is used more which it would if it's changed to start further up the road.

Cars will still try and pass each other, meaning 3 cars side by side on the road. This would make it very difficult for us to drive in and out safely as we have to stick the nose of our car out into the road to see what's coming around the bend, and because of the angle of our drive entrance we need to go across to the other side of the road to gain entrance if approaching from the Vine end.

In fact the other day a friend of mine and her child were very nearly hit whilst standing in my drive, by a car that swerved into the entrance of our drive to avoid an on-coming car - There were cars parked in the carparking bay at the time.

It does seem a bit strange to me to encourage parked cars away from a straight bit of road to an area with head?

We have no problem in theory with people parking outside our house, but not if it causes unnecessary danger to ourselves and other road users.
