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Swanley and District as a Dementia Friendly Community – Informal Review (First DRAFT)

Area of need covered is essentially the Northern Parishes of Sevenoaks District. Many of the organisations offering services are located at varying distance from the area of need. Travel by public transport is not fast and convenient.
