1. Procedure at Sub-Committees of the Licensing Committee (established in accordance with Section 9 of the Licensing Act 2003)

- 1.1 In accordance with Section 9(1) of the Licensing Act 2003, the Licensing Committee has resolved to establish Sub-Committees, each consisting of three members of the Committee.
- 1.2 The Sub-Committees have delegated authority to determine those functions that are reserved for decision by the Sub-Committees in accordance with Appendix B of the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy dated 7 January 2011.
- 1.3 Hearings shall be conducted in accordance with this Procedure Note and The Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 subject to the right of the Sub-Committee to vary that procedure at their absolute discretion if considered in the public interest.
- 1.4 The quorum for a Sub-Committee shall be two members.
- 1.5 At the commencement of each hearing the Sub-Committee shall elect one of its members as Chairman.
- 1.6 The order of business at hearings shall be:
 - (a) Election of Chairman.
 - (b) Declarations of interests.
 - (c) Chairman explains the procedure to be followed at the hearing, including the setting of equal time limits for all parties and the granting of adjournments.
 - (d) Chairman ascertains who is assisting or representing the parties.
 - (e) Applicant (or his/her representative) addresses the Sub-Committee.
 - (f) Applicant questioned by members. At the discretion of the Sub-Committee, other parties may be permitted to question the applicant.
 - (g) Persons who have made representations in respect of the application (or their representative) address the Sub-Committee. No issues other than those relevant to their representations may be raised.
 - (h) Members question each party at the conclusion of their address. At the discretion of the Sub-Committee, the applicant may be permitted to question other parties.
 - (i) Sub-Committee may offer the parties a short adjournment to discuss in the absence of the Sub-Committee whether a solution acceptable to all the parties can be put to the Sub-Committee.
 - (j) Applicant (or his/her representative) makes closing address.
 - (k) Sub-Committee may grant a short adjournment. The parties may not speak to members regarding the application during adjournments.

- (I) The Sub-Committee considers the application and motions put to accept or reject the application in the terms requested or to grant the application subject to specified conditions. Reasons are to be given for motions.
- (m) The parties will be informed of the decision at the hearing or thereafter in accordance with Regulation 26 of the 2005 Regulation.

Introduction and Background

1. The procedure for Hearings of Sub-Committees of the Licensing Committee is established in accordance with Section 9 of the Licensing Act 2003.

2. The application is made by Kent Police, Council Offices, Argyle Road, Sevenoaks, Kent. TN13 1HG for a review of the premises licence for Edenbridge Cellar, 58 High Street, Edenbridge, Kent. TN8 5AJ on the grounds of the licensing objectives of the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm.

The Grounds for Review are:

- 3. Kent Police do not have confidence in the effective day to day management and control of this premises by the current Designated Premises Supervisor.
- 4. The DPS rarely attends the premises, and the staff are unable to contact her, either by phone or in person.
- 5. There are strong indications that staff are being left to their own devices and not supervised, either directly or remotely for extended periods of time.
- 6. This is despite efforts by Kent Police and Trading Standards to address this.
- 7. The Licensing Act 2003 is very clear that the sale of alcohol must not take place if there is not a Designated Premises Supervisor. Without this effective supervision

all the licensing objectives are compromised. Of particular concern is the risk of alcohol being supplied to children, and the resultant risk of harm associated with this.

Conclusions

Without prejudice, the Officer would like to draw to Members attention issues that they may wish to consider:

Mandatory conditions - the following conditions are already added to the premises licence.

The supply of alcohol

Where a premises licence authorises the supply of alcohol, the licence must include the following conditions:-

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

- (a) at a time where there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Mandatory Conditions in force from 06 April 2010

4. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on

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request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

Operation Schedule

Identification will be asked for of any person ordering alcohol who looks under the age of 21.

The decision is to be made with regard to the Licensing Act 2003, Secretary of State's Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Act and the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy. Where the decision departs from the Policy or Guidance the departure must be directed solely at the attainment of the licensing objectives, and such departure must be supported by clear and cogent reasons.

I write with regards to the above premises licence review. On Thursday 4 July 2013 I visited Edenbridge Cellar with Police Licensing Officer Mark Beresford, as we were visiting off-licenses in the area. I spoke to two sales assistants working in the shop. The shop displayed for sale a large amount of alcoholic drinks. The visit included:

1. Reviewing the shops refusals record

A record of refused sales of age restricted products was reviewed. This record showed that during 2013 only one member of staff had recorded refusals. This one person had only made records of refusals for the months of March and April this year. There was no evidence to suggest the refusals record is monitored.

2. Age verification policy (condition of an alcohol license)

At the time of my visit two sales assistants were standing behind the till area, working in the shop. I tried to discuss with the two sales assistants what they have to do when they sell age restricted products (such as alcohol) and how they ensure no underage sales of alcohol take place. Neither sales assistant could satisfactorily explain to me what the shop's policy is.

3. Staff training refresher

Edenbridge Cellar had a folder behind the till, which Trading Standards previously provided. This folder includes some staff training material and a refusals record template. There was evidence to show that staff had been trained on the sale of age restricted products, but nothing which showed that staff actually understood the information they were given, or are doing what they have been told. There was also no refresher training.

4. Business Advice Notice issued

At the time of visit I was aware that my colleague, Trading Standards Officer Gillian Powell, previously had a meeting with the shops Designated Premise Supervisor, to advise on the sale of age restricted products. Also present at this meeting was Police Licensing Officer Mark Beresford. From viewing Kent Trading Standards records, this meeting took place 5th November 2012. This visit was arranged due to lack of confidence in the shops age verification policy when the shop was previously visited on 11th October 2012, when Gillian Powell spoke to a sales assistant.

Therefore at the time of my recent visit I knew that comprehensive advice on the sale of age restricted products had been provided to The Designated Premise Supervisor, so I left a notice which made the following points:

- a. Lack of refusals with the refusals record not being monitored. There was no evidence to show that all staff make refusals.
- b. To have an age verification policy is a condition of having an alcohol licence, requesting contact during the next 10 days to inform me what the shop's policy is.
- c. Staff training had not been updated and should be refreshed.
- d. Whilst I specifically asked to be contacted during the next 10 days, that they should also contact me if they have any questions. At the time of this record made on 13 August 2013, I have not had a response to the notice left.


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
