Executive Summary: This report provides information to advise members of a New premises licence application under The Licensing Act 2003 in respect of Redlibbets Golf Club, West Yoke, Ash, Kent. TN15 7HT

Recommendation to Licensing Sub-Committee:

Options available to members are:

- a) To grant the application in full on the terms and conditions contained in the operating schedule along with relevant mandatory conditions
- b) To grant the application, modified to such an extent as considered appropriate in order to satisfy any relevant representations so as to adequately promote the licensing objectives
- c) To exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities
- d) To refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor
- e) To refuse the application in its entirety

Reason for recommendation: Each application must be considered on its individual merits and in relation to the licensing objectives under the Licensing Act 2003. Members are asked to consider the options above in light of the individual circumstances of this application and representations and testimony received at hearing.

Introduction and Background

- The procedure for Hearings of Sub-Committees of the Licensing Committee established in accordance with Section 9 of the Licensing Act 2003 is attached to the agenda.
- On 26 May 2020 a new premises licence application was received from Get Golfing CIO for a new premises licence for Redlibbets Golf Club, West Yoke, Ash, Kent. TN15 7HT. This application was validated on 4 June 2020 and the consultation end date was 2 July 2020.
- Currently there is a Premises Licence in the name of F.C. Stark Limited, trading as Corinthian Sports Club & Redlibbets Golf Club. This Licence will remain and covers both clubs. (Current Licence attached as Appendix E)
- 4 15 representations have been received from local residents and the Environmental Protection team. (Representations are attached as Appendix C).
- 5 The application is to allow the following licensable activities on the premises.

The application is to:

Section E	To allow Live music both indoors and outdoors every day from 10:00 to 01:00 hours.
Non-standard timings	Bank Holidays and New Year's Eve until 01:30 hours.
Section F	To allow Recorded music both indoors and outdoors every day from 10:00 to 01:00 hours.
Non-standard timings	Bank Holidays and New Year's Eve until 01:30 hours.
Section H	To allow Anything similar to Live music, Recorded music or performance of dance both indoors and outdoors every day from 10:00 to 01:00 hours.
Non-standard timings	Bank Holidays and New Year's Eve until 02:00 hours.
Section L	To allow Late night refreshment both indoors and outdoors every day from 23:00 to 01:00 hours.

Non-standard timings	Bank Holidays and New Year's Eve until 01:30 hours.
Section M	To allow the supply of alcohol for consumption both on and off the premises every day from 10:00 to 01:00 hours.
Non-standard timings	Bank Holidays and New Year's Eve until 01:30 hours.
Section L	To allow the premises to be open to the public every day from 06:30 to 01:30 hours.
Non-standard opening hours	New Year's Eve until 02:00 hours.

The application includes Live and Recorded music. By virtue of the Live Music Act 2012, the Entertainment Amendment Order 2013 and/or the Deregulation Act 2015, Amplified Live Music and Recorded Music is allowed at a licensed Premises with an audience capacity of no more than 500 persons from 08:00 to 23:00 hours. Unamplified Live Music is also allowed from 08:00 to 23:00 hours in all venues with unlimited audience capacity.

The applicant intends to take the actions detailed in the operating schedule (Appendix B) in order to promote the four licensing objectives detailed below if the proposed application is granted.

Statutory Guidance

Revised Section 182 Guidance (April 2018)

Licensing objectives and aims

Paragraph 1.2

The legislation provides a clear focus on the promotion of four statutory objectives which must be addressed when licensing functions are undertaken.

Paragraph 1.3

The licensing objectives are:

- The prevention of crime and disorder;
- Public safety:
- The prevention of public nuisance; and
- The protection of children from harm.

Paragraph 1.4

Each objective is of equal importance. There are no other statutory licensing objectives, so that the promotion of the four objectives is a paramount consideration at all times.

Consultation

The regulations to the Licensing Act 2003 outline the requirements for the advertising of applications. These require the applicant to advertise the application:

- a. For a period of no less that 28 consecutive days starting on the day after the day on which the application was given to the relevant licensing authority to display a blue notice prominently at or on the premises to which the application relates where it can be conveniently read from the exterior of the premises. It was noted that the notice was displayed upon the premises for the 28 day consultation period which ended 9 May 2019.
- b. By publishing a notice in a local newspaper on at least one occasion within 10 working days of submitting the application.

Regulations also require that the applicant give a copy of the application to each responsible authority on the same day as the day upon which it is given to the licensing authority. As the application was electronic, the requirement to serve the application was met by the licensing authority.

There are no other statutory requirements for advertising of any application, however, details of all applications received along with the time limit for receipt of representations is posted on the Council website via the weekly premises tracker and the public and councillors have public access.

Conclusions

Without prejudice, the Officer would like to draw Members' attention to issues that they may wish to consider.

The decision is to be made with regard to the Licensing Act 2003, Secretary of State's Amended Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Act and the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy under the Licensing Act 2003. Where the decision departs from the Policy or Guidance the departure must be directed at the Licensing Objectives and such departure must be supported by clear and cogent reasons

Mandatory conditions - the following conditions will be added to the premises licence when it is issued.

1. The supply of alcohol

- Where a premises licence authorises the supply of alcohol, the licence must include the following conditions:-

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

- (a) at a time where there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

2. Mandatory conditions in force from 28 May 2014

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1-
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula— $P = D + (D \times V)$

where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4.

- (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

3. Mandatory Conditions in force from 01 October 2014

1.

- (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

3.

(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that—
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."





Existing Lower Ground Floor 1:100 @ A1



Good evening

I understand that an application has been made by Get Golfing Club regarding their premises at Redlibbets Golf Club, West Yoke, Ash, Kent, TN15 7HT.

As a local resident to Redlibbets Golf Club I wish to register my objection to all aspects of the licensing application based on the following grounds.

- Noise / Nuisance presently the noise at Redlibbets carries to the neighbouring properties causing a disturbance, particularly in the night during events in the Summer and over Christmas/ New Year. Personally, as a mum of a young family the music played at these events causes a nuisance and has often gone late into the night, causing my son to wake and all of us to be unable to sleep. Extending their licensing would just make this already bad situation even worse, severely affecting the mental health of my family.
- Impact to local businesses and charities there are several businesses in the area which already offer music and refreshments until late and do so in a manner that is respectful to their neighbours. For example the White Swan in Ash Road or the Royal Oak in Chapelwood Road New Ash Green. Extending the licensing at Redlibbets would take away much needed custom from these businesses, which due to Coronavirus could already be struggling. Furthermore, I have seen first hand how the noise and fireworks displays at Redlibbets has disturbed and caused upset to the animals kept at the local animal sanctuary that backs on to the Golf course. Granting their licensing conditions will just make this matter worse and cause distress to these rescue animals.
- Safeguarding Redlibbets golf course backs on to the Buzy Bees soft play and Beaming Stars Nursery. Serving alcohol at the times specified would pose a severe safeguarding and child safety risk to the children that visit and attend here, and could be distressing for the parents. You would surely not open a pub directly next to a school, so why allow for a neighbouring property to a nursery/ play centre to serve alcohol at the times specified?
- Environmental Redlibbets already have shown a disregard to the local environment. In particular they have cleared and burned trees which has destroyed the habitat for Buzzards in the area, which are a protected species under the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981. I would be worried that this behaviour would become worse if the licensing application was approved.
- **Infrastructure** Accessing the golf course is through narrow country lanes, extending their licensing to the hours and days proposed could cause severe traffic and potential accidents. The current road infrastructure simply can not support the extra visitors to the golf course if this application was approved.

I hope that you will consider my objections to the licensing application and the impact it will have on the environment and local community.

We are putting forward an objection regarding the application for licensable activities and proposed hours of opening at REDLIBBETS GOLF CLUB WEST YOKE ASH KENT. TN15. 7HT

My parents live in Keepers cottage, Manor Lane, Fawkham, Kent which is situated along the boundary of the above golf course.

Our boundary fence runs along the golf course driveway, golf course greens and outbuildings that hold all the machines and tools.

There has never been a notice put through our mail box and due to the coronavirus my parents have not left the house as i hope you understand as elderly and my mother has had a major stroke.

We initially had no idea an application had been made until their granddaughter saw a white item attached to the telegraph pole right down the bottom of their field facing the opposite direction. This notice has kept being taken down on a regular basis and we keep putting it back up. (Can't understand who is doing this and why)

When my parents bought our family home we knew that brands hatch race course was near and depending in which way the wind blows you can hear the cars.

This does not bother us as brands hatch was there many years previous to us living here and we knew what to accept.

We never expected a golf course to be built and causing so much upset to our lives the way it has especially at my parents time in life.

The land which is now the golf course was once a lovely, restful, quiet and meaningful dairy farm. This is one of the reasons why they purchased the property for its tranquil environment.

Now they have machines starting up right by their house anytime from 5am in the morning waking them up and disturbing their sleep.

We are objecting to the proposal because of the traffic and mainly weekend noise at the moment from parties and gatherings as it is loud and there is no respect for near by neighbours. If the hours are extended it will be unfair to local residents and ourselves.

Before the coronavirus we have had to put up with traffic at all hours, loud revving engines, fast driving and music blasting from vehicles.

The club house can been seen from their property and the noise carries and keeps them/ us awake (if staying over) and disturbs them on a regular basis.

They/we have put up with very loud music, shouting from people that are drunk and rowdy and fire works. We have people walking past our house to go home once the club house has shut drunk, shouting, singing and generally making an nuisance of themselves. This is very upsetting and disturbs us and their dogs which then don't settle. Yet again this is on a regular basis. (Before coronavirus)

If these hours and days are to be extended and agreed our lives will be ruined and stressful. The whole point of moving to this area 46 years ago was for a calming and peaceful quality of life.

I would also like to mention so it is registered that the properties behind my parents (2no cottages) would not put in any objections as its owned by the golf course and the staff reside in these properties)

The other concern we have and would also like it too be taken into account that their property would be greatly decreased in value as no-one in their right mind would want to have all this upset and disruption. (sleep deprivation can cause many heath issues)

I have recently learnt of the licensing application submitted by Get Golfing CIO as it pertains to Redlibbetts Golf Club.

This application has caused a great deal of consternation, both to me and fellow residents. Our recent awareness of this application only made upon discovery of a solitar sign on a post in perhaps the least travelled lane in the area!

Either way, I wish to strongly object to this application, on a number of grounds.

First, I have read the applicant's proposal, located on SDC's website. I was astounded to read the applicant's claim within the 'General description of premises' (page 5) which asserted the "applied licensing activities... would not have an impact...". How would they know? None of the residents, businesses or other premises (inc. an adjacent animal sanctuary) have been consulted. I am also fairly certain the applicant/s do not live in the vicinity so would be ill-informed as to the likely impact.

As a resident in an adjacent property I feel rather more qualified to comment on the impact, not least as I / we have had prior experience of events (weddings, corporate functions) held at Redlibbetts.

The acoustic bubble for this venue, as demonstrated by previous events, is huge, far exceeding the venue's perimeter. The level of noise is both sustained and significant, extending into the early hours. Not only does this have a deleterious impact on residents' ability to quietly enjoy their own domicile, it adversely affects the ability to sleep. The latter point being a critical one as a Key Worker, I require uninterrupted sleep to effectively perform my duties which entails the support of vulnerable people.

The noise level, as well as loud and sustained firework activity, has also distressed pets and rescue animals that exist within my home environment.

The quiet rural location in which I live was specially selected for these essential qualities. After a demanding day's work, I find the respite my home environment offers a comfort and much needed contrast to my working life.

The thought of this being effectively ruined by a neighbouring concern, purely to cater for others' entertainment is a horrific prospect.

As a key worker living and working within Sevenoaks District, and indeed working alongside colleagues based at SDC, I would hope this assessment carries some 'weight'.

The Get Golfing CIO concern is a relatively newly registered charity, whose own publicity is extremely vague about the service it provides to others. It is a money-making concern which has a negligible contribution to make to wider society.

I sincerely hope that the desires and requirements of those of us that have specially chosen to settle and live in this rare quiet corner of Sevenoaks District, are favourably considered against those of a corporate venture which is only interested in lining their own deep pockets and have thus far only shown a cavalier / contemptuous attitude towards those of us who have the misfortune of being their 'neighbours'.

In summary, please do not grant Get Golfing CIO / Redlibbetts any extension to existing licensing activities. Look after your hard working residents who want no more than to enjoy the peaceful sanctity of their home environment. This is entirely in your gift to give. Thank you.

It would appear that the excessive increase in the licencing hours will change the identity of the Golf Club from purely providing in house facilities to their members, with limited functions, to a wider ranging spectrum of activities, reflecting a change to a Country /

Night Club. Possibly a change of use in terms of

occupancy.

This will also worsen the traffic situation. With licencing commencing from 10:00am to 01:00 am or later drivers negotiating an already difficult access and egress to the club may find the process more hazardous, which will

have a knock on effect to pedestrians as well as other road users.

The situation with noise pollution is bad enough currently, however with the envisaged extension for indoor and outdoor live or recorded music it would be intolerable if an open ended licence were granted. The White Swan public house also has open air functions involving entertainment which can be heard from our home, and by other residents in the vicinity resulting in the potential of noise pollution from two directions.

The new leaseholders do not have a valid variation to the planning restrictions to operate within the hours that they are requesting, (at Redlibbets Golf Club). They do not have planning permission to request or carry out these intensified licensing activities. The new leaseholders have shown little concern for their own natural environment in the pursuit of profits; they have butchered about an acre of mature trees simply to let more light into one of the greens, destroying a Buzzards nest and a habitat for long eared Owls. They have littered the beauty of this mature landscape with cheap, hideous commercial advertising hoardings to gain revenue, which by their own admission are of little commercial value. They even nail signs to mature oak trees and secretly burn rubbish on site. (out of view)

They have dug up and moved bunkers and golf course features to improve the speed of play and get more people through the gate. All done without planning permission.

The noise of outdoor events is unrestricted and readily travels long distances up and down the valley. At present the noise of people shouting "fore" and generally having conversations can be heard several hundred metres from the source. The leaf blower which operates all day, everyday, during the winter produces a continuous din from all areas of the golf course. The idea that the outdoor events will only happen in daylight hours is a nonsense as they have already hosted several fireworks displays at 10pm.

The tidal flow of traffic caused by the proposed activities will create even more chaos and verge damage around the only access point which is approached along narrow country lanes. Whilst I have no objection to the correct operating procedures being followed they are insignificant protocols when they current leaseholders have already shown a cavalier attitude to the natural environment and now propose to inflict noise, nuisance and traffic upon an already congested area. Olivers Farm is bounded on three sides of its land by the golf course. The fourth side is a narrow country lane. I live here with my family and many vulnerable rescued animals. Although I have never received official notification of the application, (and wonder how many other neighbours are unaware of what is being proposed) as the owner of Olivers Farm I would like to register my objections, in the strongest terms possible, to the above licensing application on the following grounds:

- 1. The current evening noise pollution from the golf club events including revelry, music and fireworks are already clearly heard in and around my home and animal sanctuary. Added to this the daily machinery noise, which starts very early, for, I assume ground maintenance, are more than enough to endure.
- 2. It will therefore be intolerable for my family and the many nervous animals in our care for the club to be granted a licence from 10.00 am until 01.00 am for alcohol sales and to hold indoor and outdoor events for 7 days a week. The increase in noise created from revellers, music and fireworks into the early hours of the morning would be insufferable.
- 3. The increased road traffic caused by the proposed activities will create even more chaos and verge damage around the only access point which is approached along narrow country lanes.

Further items of concern

Should the licence be granted, my experience so far of the leaseholders does not fill me with confidence that they would be at all concerned for their environment or neighbours. To let more light onto one of their greens, they have butchered the woods at the back of my property. The nesting buzzards are no longer here and the habitat for the long-eared owls along with any other wildlife is threatened if not already destroyed.

Another example of their lack of neighbourliness was felt when they were removing trees. They finished for the day leaving a very large one across my boundary and paddock fencing therefore leaving any of my animals potentially to injure themselves or escape. I had to contact them myself to ask them to remove it and repair my fences. They did make good my paddock fencing but placed much of it between my boundary wire and paddock fencing therefore prohibiting us now from using our own walkway. The frequent fires started in the woods are always a worry.

The culling of the trees has also opened us up to more noise and many more golf balls obviously causing a major hazard to children and animals.

In addition to these problems their drainage system keeping their courses dry results in extreme flooding of my paddocks at times of the year. As good neighbours their priority should be to address these problems before pursuing new ventures.

The supply of alcohol

- Where a premises licence authorises the supply of alcohol, the licence must include the following conditions:-

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

- (a) at a time where there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Mandatory Conditions in force from 06 April 2010

1. The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

Irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children -

- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
- (i) Drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii) Drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on -
- (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
- (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

- 3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 4. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that -
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.
