Reason for Decision

- Cabinet, on 8 May 2014 approved the guidelines for the Repair & Renew Grant and delegated authority to the Economic & Community Development Portfolio Holder to agree funding. After DEFRA made changes to the scheme in late May, Cabinet agreed changes to the Guidelines on 5 June 2014.
- Funding that this Council pays out under the Repair & Renew Grant is claimed back quarterly from DEFRA.
- For the final round of the grant, nine applications were received and appraised on 28 October 2014.
- Officers recommended that seven applications, from 91 High Street (Edenbridge), Riverside, High Street (Otford), 99 Millstone Close (South Darenth), Quintins, Brasted Hall Road (Brasted), Flat 3, 142 Main Road (Sundridge), The Lodge, Squerryes (Westerham), 127 High Street (Edenbridge) be awarded a total of £ 27,001.21.
- Two applications, one from Main Road, Sundridge and one from Mill Hill, Edenbridge, were not recommended to receive funding, as both applications were not eligible.
