



# Potential new parking restrictions - Sycamore Drive, Swanley.

I am concerned that you are reducing the parking bays in Sycamore Drive which will inconvenience our parents and carers dramatically when they want to drop of their children in the mornings and pick them up in the afternoons.

I cannot see the connection between turning right out of Sycamore Drive and reducing parking spaces. We would have thought the impact would be on people turning left not right.

The problem for the buses I can understand but this can be solved by moving traffic in one car width and narrowing the footpath.

If the footpath was narrowed, starting at St. Bartholomew's gates and all the way to the Holy Apostles gate providing a parking bay for parents and carers it would move their parked cars out of the way of the moving traffic.

The present problems are not only caused by the school traffic but the introduction of an Ambulance Station and Bus Route which have been added in recent years.

We have just seen the regulation change planned for Oakleigh Close. This impacts on our staff's ability to park between 11 am and 12 am.

All the occupants of Oakleigh Close have off road parking and all have garages which they have chosen to brick up or use as residence.

Why does the street need double yellow lines which seriously inconveniences our staff who now will have nowhere to park near the school. As tax paying members of society they should be able to park at a reasonable distance from their place of work. We can't see what can be achieved by putting on these restrictions in Oakleigh Close.

Dear Sirs,

I am not in favour of these proposed changes as they stand.

- 1) It's not clear how many residents have asked for new parking restrictions. They have not made any attempt to get support from the households in the close, therefore they can't have any idea of how popular/unpopular the proposal is, prior to approaching you and taking up your valuable time.
- 2) I have lived in the close for 8 1/2 years and have not noticed any "obstructive" parking in the entrance area. The only time there is congestion is of course school start/end times but this is only Mon to Fri term time for 30 mins twice a day.

In my experience, drivers coming into and going out of the close are forced to be careful when cars are parked there because there is obviously only limited space. This prevents them from accelerating aggressively into the close or out towards Sycamore Drive.

- 3) The problem with the new restriction is that although it would prevent "outsiders" from parking, it would also prevent residents and their visitors from parking there. It's occasionally very useful for a resident to be able to park an extra car there all-day. I am sure you have seen how cramped the main close is.
- 4) If you think that extra restrictions are appropriate, then how about making that space permit-only, and issue one non-expiring permit free-of-charge to each address in the close. This would keep out the "outsiders" but would allow residents to make use of the current space on a first-come first-served basis and it would restrict the maximum possible demand to 49 vehicles or so.

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

> We write in connection with the above proposed plans to restrict parking in the Oakleigh close area, to which we do strongly object to.

> Our reasons for not being in favour are based on the following observations and factors. As residents of Oakleigh Close there are many concerns which are addressed below:

- > 1. Scarce Car parking
- > As a resident of Oakleigh Close there is an issue of scarce car parking spaces for residents and for their family and friends when they visit. Yes each household has a drive to park one car, and yes most houses do have garages. However, with first hand experience these garages are not appropriate for a standard car of today and therefore most residents use their garage space for storage as the garages provided are rather small.
- > It is impossible for each household to park a car outside of their
- > houses as this would create an issue on the road for when another car
- > would need to pass by. There are already a number of houses on
- > Oakleigh Close parking across their drives as can be seen in Fig2/3.

> restricted parking conditions for non residents and therefore parking permits should be provided to the residents of Oakleigh Close as we should take precedence over "non - residents" in the case of family and friends visiting households should be granted minimum of one permit for visitors.

> 3. School parking

- > It seems unfair for the school to be granted parking area around Kennett court. The council are therefore giving priority to "non-residents". As council tax payers for the area we deem this to be very unfair. Surely we should be allowed to park more than one car in the area we live.
- > We do hope each point made above is considered as valid and taken into consideration, evaluating the factors which are making the proposal seem difficult and unfair for the residents of Oakleigh close.

Dear Mr Bracey

I appreciate I may well have missed the deadline for consultation on proposed parking changes to Sycamore Drive and Oakleigh Close, Swanley, however I hope you are still able to take in to consideration my concerns, which I will detail for you below:

As a resident of Oakleigh Close for in excess of 20 years, I have struggled daily with the congestion and, quite frankly, ill manners of drivers who congregate around and block said roads twice daily, namely for the morning "school run" and again for the afternoon.

Said drivers would appear to have no concept, when dropping their children off at school, of the idea they are not the only road users, and that everyone else is trying to get somewhere. I have often had to get out of my car to actually advise some drivers as to how to manoeuvre their vehicles, after waiting in excess of 10 minutes whilst they sit behind the steering wheel, stunned and afraid, by the traffic they have caused around them. They simply seem to drive themselves into impossible situations and then sit, staring blankly, waiting for other drivers to try and get past them, who have to negotiate the abundance of abandoned vehicles which are often double parked, not to mention those who like to pull out on to oncoming traffic without looking.

Not only does this present a hazard for other drivers, it also, or course, presents safety issues for those of the walking public.

The proposals outlined in your letter claim to restrict all day parking even further, to *enable* "drop-off and pick up" to continue!

I am deeply upset and disturbed by this proposal which would appear to put those who commute at great disadvantage, who are already severely penalised by the extortionate rail fares they have to endure in order to get to their place of work (I do not commute myself, at present, however I do have a lot of empathy for those who do). And I should imagine it is the commuters who are going to be put out as they try to find all day parking relatively close to the station.

I believe restricting all day parking even further is going to create further congestion and mayhem from the aforementioned people carrying out "school runs". A vehicle left "all day" creates no

congestion, it simply remains stable, whereas the continuous stream of confused, entitled school run drivers leads to chaos, frustration and absolute road block.

I believe it would be a far better solution to make Sycamore Drive one way only, thus improving the flow of traffic and preventing the disorder I have struggled with for years.

A further solution, although not one that I can imagine would be enforceable, would be perhaps to use the tax-payers money that is going to be spent on the said proposal to create schemes which enable and support more parents to *walk* their children to school, thus improving the health, physically and psychologically, of all concerned.
