# Subject: Altering the discretionary grant maximum associated with the District Council's Private Sector Housing Assistance Policy (2020-22). Details of Decision taken Increasing the maximum level of funding for Accelerated Facilities Grants (AFGs) from £6,500 to £8,000 and from £1,000 to £3,000 on Safe and Secure Grants. Reason for Decision Since the introduction of the non-means tested discretionary AFG in November 2017 and a current £6,500 limit, the majority of customers have used this grant to obtain much-needed adaptations. However, we have seen an increase in overall costs associated with adaptations, partly linked to increased costs from the supply chain due to COVID-19 as well adaptations taking longer than usual due to safety precautions linked with the Pandemic. We are also seeing a number of our clients with more complex needs, meaning adaptations are becoming more costly as well as the integration of more modern assistive

Since the introduction of the SSGs, we have seen an increase in a number of referrals for hoarding and filthy and verminous cases requiring clearance and minor repairs. We are finding that the current maximum is not sufficient to
