Weald Recreation Ground is regularly used by Weald Cricket Club, Weald Wolves football club and Weald Stoolball. In addition it is available to hire to members of the local community and has been used for adhoc sporting fixtures and birthday parties. Whilst it is a great asset to the village to encourage sport and a healthy lifestyle it is in need of significant improvements, both for safety reasons and to ensure the continued development of the above mentioned clubs and other uses. In the heart of the Green Belt and AONB development is very limited but the recreation ground is an essential facility to support the health and wellbeing of local residents. Given Weald's position it also supports residents from new developments outside the village, as evidenced by the successful growth of Weald Wolves.

During the summer months parking is available on the ground itself, however during the winter the ground is unsuitable for cars. Weald Wolves is a very successful junior football club and following the increase in numbers attending parking on Morleys Road, the road near the recreation ground, during home matches has become very unsafe. The road is not very wide and there is a sweeping bend making it difficult to see oncoming cars. Over the last few years there have been a number of near misses for both cars and child and adult pedestrians. The proposed parking area would resolve this issue.

There are two buildings at the recreation ground – a pavilion and a changing room block. Both of these are run from an ageing diesel generator. The lack of electricity also makes maintenance and cleaning of the buildings and ground very challenging.

Finally the track leading to the ground is increasingly worn with ineffective patching resulting in progressively deeper potholes. This is not only difficult for access for users of the ground but also for services such as the bin lorries and large mowing equipment.

14 How is the scheme related to these developments?

Weald Recreation Ground is a critical facility for junior and adult sport in the village.

Weald Cricket Club has been based at the recreation ground for over 125 years. It's currently an adult team but has previously also run youth coaching and is always keen to support the development of new players in the village, with an active recruitment campaign.

Weald Wolves Football Club has grown significantly over the last 10 years, partly linked to the increase in class numbers and size at Weald Community Primary School. It is a very successful club with approximately 120 members and 9 teams. It is run by volunteers and supported by a number of parents who are keen to ensure their children are active and maintain good fitness levels.

Weald Stoolball club is more recently formed and well supported by members of the local community. The availability of local sporting facilities was an essential requirement for the development of this group and would be for any future sports clubs members of the community may wish to form.

The parish council is currently in discussion with local landlords, with land adjacent to the recreation ground to provide land that will be used for off-road parking. This will significantly improve safety in the village, removing a number of cars from the roadside of a sweeping bend with very limited visibility. This road is the main road into the village with a 40mph speed limit and no pavements. The electrical connection and the new surface for the access track will improve the facilities for existing users as their clubs continue to grow and will also allow for increased usage by the community, for example for birthday parties, adhoc fixtures and hopefully the continued development of new sports groups.

The recreation ground provides a local and cost-effective facility for the clubs previously mentioned as well as many local members of the community. Having these facilities ensures users can maintain their membership, delivering community development and preserving the volunteering network which has huge economic benefits for the village and local area.

The main benefit of the parking will be safety, reducing the occurrence and impact of accidents. This is particularly important for the Weald Wolves Football club as they are currently unable to park on the ground during the winter and it will therefore allow them to continue to thrive as a club. Improved parking will also provide the opportunity for children's football and other sports camps, and use by other commercial events during the winter months thereby providing an economic benefit to the village.

Recently people enquiring to hire the ground have been put off by the lack of electricity and reliance on an old generator. It is therefore hoped that an electrical connection will encourage greater usage of the ground, providing income for the village and a space for local businesses to use. The improved track service will provide an economic benefit by removing the requirement for short term, inadequate repairs which are extremely uneconomical.

As well as the economic benefits to the village and local community mentioned above, participation in sport has numerous physical and mental health benefits. Increasing fitness and wellbeing ultimately reduces costs for the NHS and other local health and wellbeing services.

The covid pandemic has only highlighted the importance of community cohesion. Weald recreation ground and the sport it enables brings people together, supports local clubs to form and flourish and creates a strong sense of community and inclusion. By enhancing the current site, and improving the safety of parking in the winter, we hope many more people will make use of the facilities and join the available clubs.

In addition to the community benefit the recreation ground is a critical facility for supporting the well-being and health of many residents of all ages. The physical and mental health benefits of sport are well recognised. Improved educational attainment has also been linked to sport participation. Motivating students and improving social relations with peers and persons in authority stimulates co-ordination, enhances strength and further develops levels of concentration.

The safety benefit of the improved parking cannot be underestimated, particularly for children in the community who will (indirectly) be the predominant users of this when they attend junior football. The current track surface makes the ground relatively inaccessible for those with additional needs for example in wheelchairs, so the new surface will rectify this. Finally we hope the electrical connection will encourage more people to use the ground, rather than be concerned about using the generator, thereby increasing the opportunity for social gatherings.

Providing local facilities reduces the need for car travel, particularly given the increasingly reduced bus services to the village. The parish council is committed to updating the facilities at the recreation ground to ensure this continues to be the case, to meet the needs of local residents and those in the surrounding areas.

As well as the safety aspect the parking area will lower the environmental impact of parking along the road which currently results in significant erosion of the verges and impacts hedgerow habitats. The new parking is designed to blend with its surroundings and have a minimal impact on the environment, with grass able to grow through the matting that will be used.

The current generator used to power the buildings at the recreation ground is an ageing, inefficient diesel generator. The new electrical connection will therefore have a significant environmental benefit.

Finally the regular patching of the access track is extremely inefficient and therefore environmentally unfriendly. A new surface will allow this area to remain untouched for a number of years.

There are a number of local and Kent wide strategies and plans that the scheme supports. For example Sevenoaks District Council Community Plan includes objectives to support community assets and community activities, to deliver the priorities of a health environment and a sustainable economy. The improvements at the recreation ground would support both of these adopted priorities.

The SDC Health Inequalities Action Plan, which is linked to a Kent wide health inequalities plan, states the need to provide sporting facilities to promote a healthy lifestyle for children and to develop healthy communities. As documented in the above benefits sections, the improvements very much support this plan.

Finally the SDC Economic Development Strategy states the need for infrastructure to service the health of our communities, which these developments will

From a Kent wide perspective the Kent Sport strategy 'Towards an Active County' recognises the need to improve facilities, support volunteering and support opportunities for children and young people to be active. These would all be achieved through the improvements at the recreation ground, with all the main clubs using the ground currently run by an extensive volunteer network.

The Kent and Medway Integrated Care System also recognises the need for people to support their physical and mental health in preventing illness. As noted above the local facility provided by Weald recreation ground is essential for supporting the health of the local community.
